RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF “FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MURAL
PROJECT”**

- Whereas,** It is the mission of Associated Students at San José State University to support and represent the students of San José State University by continuing the organization’s legacy of student advocacy and leadership; to enhance SJSU students’ education through high-quality programs and services and to prepare students as they move towards a thoughtful and purposeful life after graduation; and
- Whereas,** Associated Students (A.S.) is the official voice of over 36,000 students at San José State University (SJSU); and
- Whereas,** “Filipino Americans are the second-largest Asian American ethnic group in the U.S. and the first documented Asian people to arrive in the country¹”; and
- Whereas,** Roughly 38% of Filipino Americans live in California²; and
- Whereas,** Filipino Americans make up about 10% of San José’s population³; and
- Whereas,** In the 1920s⁴ to 1950s, San José had a Pinoytown in present-day Japantown where Filipino families and Filipino-owned businesses could find a community and thrive⁵; and
- Whereas,** SJSU identifies as an Asian American Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution (AANAPISI)⁶, with approximately 36.1% of San José State students identifying as Asian⁷; and

- Whereas,** San José State University has several recognized student organizations such as AkbayanSJSU, Alpha Kappa Omicron, and the League of Filipino Students, among others, that create a community for students to embrace their Filipino/a/x culture and heritage; and
- Whereas,** Filipino student activists played a crucial role in organizing the Third World Liberation Front, the longest student strike in history which resulted in the creation of the first College of Ethnic Studies at San Francisco State University⁸; and
- Whereas,** U.S. imperialism has led to the erasure of Filipino American contributions throughout much of U.S. history⁹; and
- Whereas,** Larry Itliong was a Filipino activist who led the Filipino American farmworkers, called the "Manongs," or respected elder workers. He organized groups such as the Agricultural Workers Organizing Committee (AWOC), a union that was largely Filipino but also included Black, Latino, and Arab workers¹⁰; and
- Whereas,** Larry Itliong worked alongside Philip Vera Cruz, another Filipino labor leader and farmworker, to lead the Delano Grape Strike. They collectively convinced César Chávez and Dolores Huerta to have the Filipino and Latino farmworkers join forces¹¹; and
- Whereas,** As a symbol of unity at the end of group meetings, the farmworkers would participate in a unity clap entitled, "Isang Bagsak," which symbolized solidarity amongst the Filipino and Latino farmworkers.¹² The strike was successful, improving conditions for farmworkers and creating a merged labor union, the United Farm Workers (UFW)¹³; and

- Whereas,** The Arch of Dignity, Equality, and Justice was created in 2008 by Judith Baca to honor César Chávez and Dolores Huerta, who were influential figures in the United Farm Workers Movement¹⁴; and
- Whereas,** The Arch of Dignity only commemorates the Mexican-American contributions to the United Farm Workers Movement; and
- Whereas,** In April 2023, Students for Filipino Farmworkers organized a rally in front of the Arch of Dignity, demanding that the contributions of Filipino farmworkers in the United Farm Workers Movement do not go unrecognized¹⁵; and
- Whereas,** University President, Dr. Cynthia Teniente-Matson, met with the students spearheading the protest efforts and committed \$25,000 from the Diaz Compean Fund for the Filipino American History Mural Project; and
- Whereas,** Convened in July 2024, SJSU's Filipino American History Mural Committee (FAHMC) is organizing to unveil the Filipino American History Mural by October 2025. This coalition is comprised of students, alumni, SJSU staff, and community members who are advocating for the recognition of Filipino contributions throughout American history, especially those in the United Farmworkers Movement; and
- Whereas,** On September 4, 2024, ABC7 News published a press release to publicize the committee's efforts and raise awareness about the significance of acknowledging Filipino American History with interviews from A.S. President Ariana Lacson, SJSU's Filipino Alumni Network (FAN) Founder & Board Chair Alan Gouig, Asian American Studies Assistant Professor Dr. Wayne Jopanda, and the Founder of Pinoytown San José, Manong Robert Ragsac Sr.¹⁶; and be it
- Resolved,** That SJSU Associated Students stands in support of the Filipino American History Mural Project; and be it further
- Resolved,** That SJSU Associated Students Student Government urges Associated Students to donate money for the mural; and be it further


