

Associated Students, SJSU, Board of Directors' Resolution 20/21-05 Resolution in Support of South Western Asian and North African Addition to Cal State Apply (SWANA)

Whereas, it is the mission of Associated Students of San José State University to represent the

students of San José State University and continually improve the quality of their

educational opportunity and experience; and

Whereas, Associated Students (A.S.) is the official voice of over 33,000 students at San José

State University (SJSU); and

Whereas, SJSU's mission statement states, "In collaboration with nearby industries and

communities, SJSU faculty and staff are dedicated to achieving the university's mission as a responsive institution of the state of California: To enrich the lives of its students, to transmit knowledge to its students along with the necessary skills for applying it in the service of our society, and to expand the base of knowledge through

research and scholarship."1; and

Whereas, SJSU was ranked #1 as the "Most Transformative College" by Money Magazine²;

and

Whereas, As outlined in Graduation Initiative 2025 which outlines a goal to "to include target

rates for both first-year students and transfer students at the four-year and six-year

markers while simultaneously eliminating equity gaps"; and

Whereas, the CSU Board of Trustees "adopts regulations and policies governing the entire

CSU system. Board committees have authority over educational policy, finance,

campus planning, and facilities, among other areas³;" and

Whereas, the current CSU application requests applicants to select their race to best describe

their racial background, but classifies Southwest Asian and North African (SWANA) applicants as White which misrepresents the Caucasian data and does not allow for

the equity gap to be addressed in the SWANA community; and ⁴

Whereas,

the classification of North Africans, Middle Easterners, and at times South Asians, as "Caucasian," is a manifestation of the historic racialization of minority groups within the United States and the exclusion of persons of Middle Eastern descent from this discourse; and ⁵

Whereas,

SWANA is a geographical term that replaces non-inclusive terms such as Middle East North Africa (MENA), Middle Eastern, or Arab; and

Whereas,

over 3.5 million SWANA people live in the United States, with the state of California having the largest population of SWANA residents; and ⁶

Whereas,

there are a vast majority of SWANA students who can not be identified from the 107,932 students who applied as White, and 19,390 who applied as Other on Cal State Apply; and 7

Whereas,

"A better sense of belonging among students at four-year institutions leads to higher rates of personal and academic successes later in their college experiences"; and ⁸

Whereas,

the lack of demographic data on the SWANA community hinders effective advocacy, programming, other educational resources, and opportunities for students, faculty, and staff in this community; and 9

Whereas,

education, celebration, and recognition of the SWANA identity could lead to reduced stigma and discrimination in the CSU derived from the lack of cultural knowledge and awareness; and 10

Whereas,

Executive Order 0318 controls the reporting of data on student ethnicity, and states "comply with state and federal reporting requirements and to assist in campus planning" and that campuses should align their ethnic surveying with their application's methods; and

Whereas,

the Undergraduate Students Association Council of University of California, Los Angeles adopted A Resolution in Support of the Creation of a Southwest Asian and North African Checkbox on the University of California Application; and

Whereas, the Associated Students Incorporated of the University of California, East Bay adopted a Resolution in Support of a Southwest Asian and North African Community; and

Whereas, the Associated Students Incorporated of the University of California, Fullerton adopted a Resolution in Support of a Southwest Asian and North African Community; and

Whereas, the current University of California application provides applicants the opportunity to select the ethnicity that best describes their ethnic background; and

Whereas, the University of California tracks the number of SWANA students within their system through their application¹¹; therefore let it be

Resolved, That in adopting this resolution, SJSU's Associated Students officially and devotedly stand in solidarity with the SWANA community and support it's students, staff, and faculty's efforts to garner awareness and center the issues of visibility and support; and

Resolved, Associated Students recommends that SJSU integrate SWANA as a demographic in all future modalities that utilize data collection that ask respondents for their region of origin this includes and is not limited to student surveys, announcements, and scholarships; and

Resolved, Associated Students recommends that SJSU's Student Affairs in collaboration with the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion identify and evaluate SJSU's SWANA community needs and articulate the necessary steps to support the SWANA community's students and staff

Resolved, Associated Students recommend that student support auxiliaries articulate programming that supports and reflects the SWANA community; and

Resolved, Associated Students encourages the CSU and SJSU to continue to promote diversity and inclusion through vigilantly understanding and updating Cal State vernacular and institutionalized data collection to include and represent all students who make up the CSU

Resolved, Associated Students encourages the California State Student Association (CSSA) to advocate for all California State University applications to include Southwest Asian

Resolved,

strongly recommends CSSA advocate to include the SWANA demographic options in all institutionalized data collection at the Chancellor's Office, state, and federal levels; and

The following Countries should be recognized as apart of but not limited to the Southwest Asian North African (SWANA) Community:

Algerian, Afghan, Armenian Assyrian/Chaldean Azerbaijani, Bahraini, Berber, Circassian, Djiboutian, Egyptian, Emirati, Georgian, Iranian, Iraqi, Israeli, Jordanian, Kurdish, Kuwaiti, Lebanese, Libyan, Mauritanian, Moroccan, Omani, Palestinian, Qatari, Saudi Arabian, Somali, Sudanese, Syrian, Tunisian, Turkish, Yemeni, Other North African, Other Southwest Asian

Resolved,
