



## Audio and video

You can import audio and video files that have been created in a variety of ways—for example, audio or video files that were recorded on your smart phone or files exported from QuickTime on your Mac. You can also import a transcript or transcribe in NVivo. You can open audio or video sources and work with them in Detail View:

**Code directly on the timeline**

**Use these controls to interact with the media, for example, play, pause, skip around or adjust the speed.**

**Use these controls to interact with the transcript, for example, add or delete rows or play the media for a selected transcript entry.**

**Drag to resize the area for coding stripes**

**Select content and code it at a node**

## Photos and other images

You can import digital photos or other images and analyze them in NVivo.

A picture source consists of a picture and a text log.

**Code directly on the picture**

**Use these controls to interact with the picture, for example, zoom, adjust brightness or contrast, as well as assign the selected region to the selected log entry.**

**Create a log to describe the picture (or just selected regions)**

**See the region that corresponds to the selected log entry**

**Use these controls to interact with the picture log, for example to add or delete a row.**

Region	Content
[Region]	Large waterfront homes. These are not indicative of typical homes of those who engage in commercial fishing, but more indicative of second or vacation homes.
[Region]	Commercial fishing boats. These are likely shrimping trawlers. Note that they have large "booms" that can be lowered laterally from the boat to hold the trawling net behind the boat as it travels.
[Region]	Recreational fishing boats
