

Terms and Conditions of Freshman Admission | Spring 2024

Provisional Admission

This offer of provisional admission is based on the academic information you reported on your Cal State Apply application. All of your academic information must be verified. Your admission will remain “provisional” until your official, final transcript(s) passes verification.

This offer of provisional admission to the academic plan (major) listed on your admission letter is only valid for this term and may not be deferred to another semester. In addition, change of major cannot be made before the beginning of the Spring 2024 semester and is not guaranteed. You must enroll in at least one course during the Spring 2024 semester to maintain your admission.

Mandatory Steps to Enrollment

To ensure your enrollment and attendance at SJSU, all of the mandatory steps below must be completed. Detailed information on each of the steps can be found in the Spring 2024 Steps to Enrollment for Freshmen (link is included in your virtual admit message in MySJSU).

Complete the Next Steps Intent to Enroll process by the date posted to your MySJSU To Do List.

Complete the following steps in the Intent to Enroll process on the Next Steps website (nextsteps.sjsu.edu) by the date posted on your MySJSU To Do List.

1. Indicate through the Intent to Enroll link that you accept SJSU's offer of provisional admission.
2. Sign up for SJSU's mandatory Sparta Camp (Frosh Orientation).
3. Pay the nonrefundable \$250 fee for the mandatory enrollment deposit. Your nonrefundable enrollment deposit includes your Sparta Camp (Frosh Orientation) payment and a deposit toward a portion of your tuition and fees for Spring 2024.

Within two business days an email confirmation will be sent to you from the nextsteps@sjsu.edu email address. Print and keep this email—it is your Next Steps receipt.

If you do not complete the entire Next Steps Intent to Enroll process by the deadline, we will withdraw your application. Please contact nextsteps@sjsu.edu before the deadline if you have any problems completing these steps.

Meet Math Enrollment Requirements

Your math enrollment requirement will depend on your major, completed mathematics coursework, test scores, and other factors. Although SAT and ACT scores are not used for admission review, they may be used to help identify options for your first math course. You are encouraged (but not required) to submit them if you have them. You will receive a MySJSU message from Supported Instruction with further details. College Writing Exercise - Reflection on College Writing

The Reflection on College Writing allows you to preview the reading and writing you will do at SJSU, and to find the writing courses you need. All freshmen admitted to SJSU complete this reflection as part of the transition to college reading and writing. Send official test scores needed to fulfill admission requirements

If you have taken and passed AP, IB or CLEP exams to satisfy any of the CSU admission requirements, request that your official scores be sent so they are received by January 15, 2024.

Attend mandatory Sparta Camp (Frosh Orientation)

If you do not attend or leave during any portion of the Sparta Camp orientation, you will be blocked from registering for classes and will not be able to attend SJSU in Spring 2024.

Send your official, high school transcript(s), including all completed grades and date of graduation, no later than Monday, January 15, 2024

This transcript must be official and include your date of high school graduation. If you completed college coursework, you must also send your final, official college transcript(s) to SJSU by January 15, 2024.

Meet the CSU minimum requirements for freshman admission

An internal review (verification) of your application will be conducted. Your official, final transcript(s) must show that you meet current impaction criteria and CSU freshman admission requirements in order to pass final verification. Failure to pass final verification will result in your admission being withdrawn.

To ensure your provisional admission passes final verification, make sure your official, final transcript meets the following criteria:

- Confirm the completion of all of your “a-g” college preparatory coursework with a grade of “C-” or better by the end of Fall 2023. SJSU will accept grades of “Credit” or “Pass” to satisfy “a-g” requirements completed during Winter, Spring, Summer or Fall 2020 terms and during Winter, Spring or Summer 2021 terms. All prior coursework must be graded and a grade of “C-” or better must be earned for the course to satisfy “a-g” requirements.
- Confirm you have a minimum high school GPA of 2.50 (California Resident) or 3.0 (Nonresident of California).
- Confirm your date of high school graduation.
- Confirm you meet the minimum impaction point index.

Monitor Your MySJSU Account – EXTREMELY IMPORTANT

SJSU communicates almost entirely by messages and To Do List items posted to your MySJSU account. Go to one.sjsu.edu and check your MySJSU account frequently for updates to your status, important messages, and invitations to upcoming events. You are responsible for compliance with all deadlines posted on your MySJSU account regarding outstanding documents. Failure to do so may result in your application or admission being withdrawn even if you have signed up for housing, attended orientation, or registered for Spring 2024 classes.
